The Power of Non-verbal Communication

Today when I sat down to write for this issue, suddenly a thought about non-verbal communication came into my mind. So, dear students! Here comes an article on one of the most important yet ignored parts of communication...nonverbals. Hope you all will like reading it!

A blink of the eye, a shrug of the shoulder, a clench of the fist, a frown, tap of the foot, a raise of the eyebrows, the speed or loudness of voice, the eye contact or lack of it – all these nonverbal activities send strong messages and they cease to stop even when we stop speaking. Infact even in our silence, we are still communicating non-verbally.

Many a times there is a wide contrast between what we say and what we communicate through body language and when a listener is encountered with these types of paradoxical situation of mixed signals and if he/she has to make a choice whether to believe the verbal or non-verbal message then in most cases nonverbal becomes the first choice. The first and foremost things one needs to learn before reading body language and non verbal signs are the ability to manage stress and recognize emotions. However, the following are three important tips for reading the non-verbal signals sent by others

• Pay attention to discrepancies: Non-verbal communication should emphasize what is being said. Is there a similarity between the person's talk and his/her body language?

- Look at non-verbal communication indications as a group: Don't be over engrossed in reading a single gesture or nonverbal cue. Consider all of the non-verbal signals being received in totality.
- Trust your instinctive feeling: Don't dismiss your gut feelings. If you get the sense that someone is not being honest or that something is not adding up, you may be picking up on a mismatch between verbal and non-verbal cues.

The concoction creating relationships goes beyond mere words. Successful non-verbal communication depends on one's ability to manage anxiety, be with acquainted own emotions. understand the signals one is sending and receiving. But unfortunately, many people send perplexing non-verbal signals without even knowing it. When this happens, both relationship and conviction are damaged.

If one wants to communicate better in all areas of life, it is important to become more sensitive to body language and other non-verbal cues, so that one can be more in tune with the thoughts and feelings of others. At the same time one needs to be extra cautious in sending signals so that one can be sure that the messages sent are what one really wants to communicate.



Karnataka Rajyostsava in RT Campus




