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Department of Community medicine Community Based Training Programme Phase II 2021 – Report

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Background

The revised curriculum reiterated by National Medical Council (NMC) has attempted to enunciate the competencies the students must be imparted and should have learnt, with clearly defined teaching learning strategies and effective methods of assessment. Communicating effectively and empathetically with patients and their relatives has been visualized as a core area of the revised curriculum.

To achieve the goals and roles for the learner;

- Training shall primarily focus on preventive and community based approaches to health and disease, with specific emphasis on national health priorities such as family welfare, communicable and non-communicable diseases including cancer, epidemics and disaster management.
- Clinical training shall emphasize early clinical exposure, skill acquisition, certification in essential skills; community/primary/secondary care-based learning experiences and emergencies

In our attempt to achieve the above a Community based training approach which has been streamlined and strengthened over the last one and half decades is being further augmented in community based training program.

Concepts

Strengthening community based teaching for UG students at M S Ramaiah Medical College

Apart from meeting Medical Council of India and Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences requirements, Ramaiah Medical College and Ramaiah Medical College Hospital enhanced the training inputs for UG medical students to be more effective in the society as doctors and lead a health team. Department of Community Medicine has been facilitating this process with the involvement and participation of Management, Principal, Registrar academics, Registrar Administration, Chief-Executive, heads of the departments in the Medical College and all heads of the disciplines of Physiotherapy, Nursing, Pharmacy and Dental.

Context

Except for a couple of medical institutions in the country, Medical Education does not meet the needs of making a basic doctor. There is wide gap between precept and practice. The proposed attempt is to strengthen and orient the teaching and training towards primary health care through Community based training to create effective health care professionals and leaders in the society.

Goals

- 1. Enable the institution to work towards social accountability in its service, training and research endeavours
- 2. Encourage the spirit of team work towards unity for health.

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- 3. Enhance effective Communication Skills through creative learning environment
- 4. Encourage development of equitable and humane attitude to vulnerable/ marginalised groups people living in villages/slums/poorest of the poor and people with disability.
- 5. Inculcate the spirit of inquiry for research aptitude.
- 6. Sensitize the students towards gender equity

Values Cherished:

Honesty, Sincerity, Integrity, Transparency, Compassion, Sympathy, Non-discriminatory attitude, Team work, Leadership qualities, concern for marginalized sections of the society like socially and/or economically backward groups, women, children, elderly, differently-abled individuals, etc.

Specific learning objectives for CBTP

Phase II

- 1. To evaluate the organization and functioning of the health care delivery system in India (Visit to primary, secondary, tertiary healthcare institutions)
- 2. To be sensitive to and identify needs (health, developmental) of vulnerable groups who require special care (Survey, Visit to school for differently abled, Visit to urban slum, School health examination)
- 3. To employ scientific methods of data collection and research in a community (Survey)
- 4. To organize and conduct health camps in a resource limited setting to provide healthcare for common illness and referral
- 5. To create health awareness and inculcate habits of healthy living in the community. (School and Community health education)
- 6. To do anthropometric measurement of individuals in given family
- 7. To explain effect of socio-environmental conditions on the health of the family
- 8. To plan and recommend suitable diet for family
- 9. To assess housing condition and presence of overcrowding in a given family
- 10. To do nutritional assessment of under five children in anganwadis

Approach

- Strengthen existing opportunities of block postings / internship in community medicine in particular.
- Initiate introduction of preliminary and advanced community based practical modules.
- Ensure participation of all disciplines in community based curriculum development, orientation, training and service.

It is hoped that experiences with communities of rural and urban in an intensified way will help our students fulfil the roles of Indian medical Graduate as envisaged by NMC. Our institution will be one of the very few institutions in the country practicing community based teaching in letter and spirit.

Process followed

In view of the COVID Pandemic, Community Based Training Program has been modified to suit the online delivery of the programme. Due to the pandemic condition, visits to the healthcare delivery facilities and community visits cannot be implemented. Hence only aspects that can be executed M.S. RAMAIAH MEDICAL COLLEGE, M.S. 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online have been taken up for the present phase II program. For the present sessions CBTP Phase II Part I learning objectives 3 and 5 was implemented.

Mode of delivery

The mode of delivery was online and Microsoft Teams was the platform that was utilised. All facilitators were trained to create breakout rooms and plenary sessions for smooth implementing of group activity and plenary sessions.

The students were divided into groups and group activities were interspersed with plenary sessions. Group activity and discussions were monitored and facilitated by a facilitator.

The students were given a set of pre reading material, are expected to read and come prepared for the sessions. Flip classroom mode of teaching was attempted during this CBTP session. Pre-reading material was uploaded on Teams platform for the students to access.

A pre and post- test were conducted before and after the program to assess the change in the cognition of the students. The assigned group activity were evaluated by the faculty with the help of checklist. The students were asked to evaluate their peers in term of of their involvement and contribution in group activities.

Expected outcomes

It is expected that the students will be equipped with:

- Knowledge and Skills necessary to prepare the health education materials on the select topic.
- An overview Knowledge of steps in carrying out research and skills required to write and implement scientific research.

As a result the following outputs are expected:

- Health education materials that can be utilised to create awareness on a select topic either on online platforms or on an offline mode.
- A research protocol with preliminary results.

Student profile

Total of 163 students participated in the program. Interdisciplinary was attempted and accordingly medical and pharmacy students participated. Nursing, dental and physiotherapy were not been able to participate as their university exams were upcoming.

- 143 Medical students

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


Role of facilitator/s IEC




