Report On National Integration Camp, Mangalore

7 Days National Integration Camp (NIC) was organized by State NSS Cell, Ministry of Youth Empowerment and Sports, Government of Karnataka in association with in NITTE University, Deralakatte, Mangalore.

Day 1, 12th February started off with an engaging session by Dr. Sripada Mehandale and Dr. Gayatri Bhat, on First Aid and CPR.
