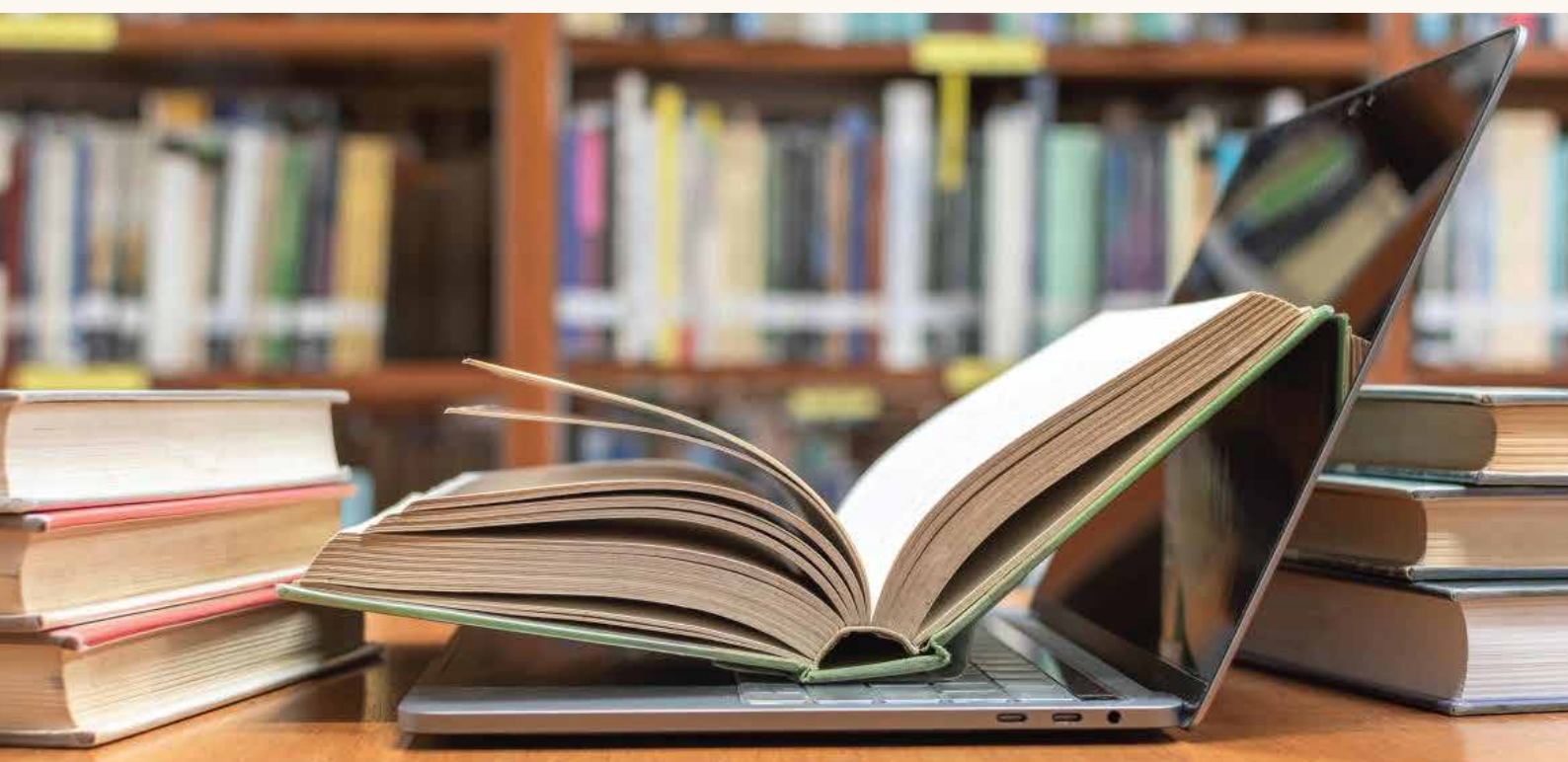

Examination Process at RUAS

The University follows a fair and transparent examination system involving various assessment methods. The University conducts its Programmes using the Semester and/or Annual pattern of University examinations as per Academic Regulations of the respective Programmes and the Examination Regulations documents. Wherever applicable, the guidelines of the statutory, regulatory bodies such as DCI, PCI, Bar Council, etc. will be followed.

The Board of Examinations (BOE) provides the framework for all examination related activities in the University. The Office of the Controller of Examinations of the University is responsible for the conduct of all University examinations, valuation, and the announcement of results and maintenance of student examination records for all programmes offered by the University as per the directions of the BOE. All the examination processes are automated and managed on the RUAS Portal (JUNO ERP system).

Normally, every course will have the assessment as below:

Component-1: Continuations Evaluation (CE) 50% weightage

The CE component will have subcomponents – Innovative Methods (25%), assignment (25%) and Midterm Examination (50%) of 2 hrs. duration.

Component-2: Semester End Examination (SEE)

The SEE is of a 3 hrs. Duration.

The students are advised to refer to the Academic Regulations, the Programme Specifications and the Course Specification documents of the respective programme for the complete details of the course contents, credits, eligibility criteria for writing the SEE, pass criterion, grading system, etc.

The Examination Calendar will be published along with the Academic Calendar. It is suggested that all students refer to the examination calendar and the periodic notifications from the COE's office about the examination processes and plan their activities accordingly.

Mentor Mentee System at RUAS

The University has a robust Mentor-Mentee System. The major objectives of this system are

- to guide and support the students on matters related to academics, review of attendance and performance,
- to encourage them to participate in various extracurricular activities for their holistic development by finding out the hidden talent of each students

Every undergraduate student (mentee) will be assigned to a Mentor and a Mentor is a member of the faculty of the department to which the student belongs to. The mentor also contacts and meets the parents of his / her mentees to discuss their progress and / or any other matter, as and when required.

General Conduct for students

Reporting to Faculty

It is mandatory for students to report on the first day. A student cannot extend his/her vacation without written permission from the Dean.

ID card will be issued in one week from the time of admission by the Admissions Office.

Attendance

- A student is required to maintain 80% attendance in order to be eligible for Semester End Examination.
- It is compulsory for every student to attend the following in online or offline mode (whatever is applicable)

Late Coming

- Students who report late for the class will not be allowed to attend the class

Leave of Absence (Procedure)

- Student must hand write the leave application and get the approval of the Dean in advance in case of planned leave
- In case of emergency the handwritten application must be submitted as soon as possible
- Informing Head Mentor, Course Leaders and Faculty Mentor is mandatory.

Civic rules

- No smoking in entire campus or faculty premises
- Presence in the faculty or campus under the influence of alcohol and illegal substances is strictly prohibited

Two Wheeler Rules

- Wearing helmet is compulsory
- Speeding is strictly prohibited
- No triple riding
- Entering 'No Entry' Lanes is strictly prohibited
- Excessive sound or noise pollution by vehicles due to removal of silencer and repeated use of vehicle horn is not allowed

Dress Code for students:

- Students must try to create a Professional Appearance from day one in the campus.
- Good grooming and neatness are required at all times.
- Hair should be neat and tidy at all times.
- Personal hygiene is a must.
- Special attention should be given to fingernails, hair and proper oral hygiene.

Dress code for boys

- Formal trousers and collared shirt; shoes and socks.

Restricted dresses

- Shorts, capris, torn trousers, jeans with holes, splits or frayed areas
- Indecent or disrespectful clothing with a printed message

Dress code for girls

- Formal dresses like salwar kameez or churidar; kurta, trousers, shirts, tops and formal foot wear.

Restricted dresses

- Shorts, capris, torn trousers, jeans with holes, splits or frayed areas, revealing deep tops, spaghetti top
- Indecent or disrespectful clothing with a printed message

University uniform is compulsory for BDS, BHM, BBA & B Com students

Simplicity, good taste and grooming are the three fundamentals of good dressing and these do not cost money.

- All the students/scholars and outsiders entering the Library shall deposit bags and other belongings at the entrance. Only notebooks and the Library books to be returned will be allowed inside.
- Identity Card is compulsory for getting access to the library.
- Books removed from the shelves by students, if not required for reference, should be kept on the book trolley or on table nearest to them
- The newspaper(s) should be folded properly after reading and kept back in the designated place.
- Readers should not deface, mark, cut, mutilate or damage library resources in any way. If anyone is found doing so, he/she will be charged the full replacement cost of the resource.
- Claim for Reference Shelf books should be made entry in the Register maintained at the counter
- Reference books are issued to students for overnight during the examination time only.
- Those students who do not return the books, issued for overnight use, in time, will not be issued any book for a period of 7 days
- All the students who want to return the books issued on their names are advised to wait until the books are shown as cancelled against their names.
- Students are advised not to issue books to others on their names.
- Conversation and discussion disturbs library ambience. Therefore, all are requested to maintain silence.
- All users are requested to keep their mobiles switched off or in silent mode in the Library
- Beverages and Eatables are not allowed inside the library.
- No visitor or guest is permitted to use the Library without prior permission
- Library reserves the right to call back any issued book/item at any time.
- Feedback and suggestion book is available at the circulation desk

The university offers hostel facility both in Ramaiah Technology Campus, Peenya as well as in Gnanagangothri campus. The students taking admissions with Faculty of Engineering & Technology, Faculty of Art & Design and Faculty of Mathematics & Physical Sciences are required to apply for the accommodation in Ramaiah Technology Campus, Peenya. Students belonging to Faculty of Dental Sciences, Faculty of Pharmacy, Faculty of Hospitality Management & Catering Technology, Faculty of Management & Commerce, Faculty of Life & Allied Health Sciences and School of Social Sciences can opt to stay in the Gnanagangothri Campus. Private hostel details is also provided for interested students.

Hostel Rules and Regulations

- ID CARD IS COMPULSORY ON CAMPUS
- All Students are expected to maintain strict discipline and are requested to abstain from indecent behavior. Any objectionable behavior which brings disgrace to Society, Parents and University will be viewed seriously and the matter will be referred to the Disciplinary Committee of the University as well as to Parents.
- Possession / Consumption of Alcohol / Any intoxicating material and Smoking on Campus is strictly prohibited.
- Periodic checks will be conducted in the hostel rooms in the presence of the hostel warden, hostel residential warden and security staff. If any student is found, in possession of any type of prohibited material, the student will be immediately expelled from the hostel and the matter will be referred to the Disciplinary Committee of the University
- Boarder if not keeping well has to inform their roommate, hostel Residential warden and hostel office, for emergency medical attention
- Boarders are to read the 'Guidelines for hostel Residents "displayed in the notice board in each of the floor and follow the guide lines
- No Outsider (Student / Visitor) other than the persons residing in the hostel will be allowed inside the hostel without prior permission from the hostel manager.
- Boarders are expected to be dressed appropriately, conforming to standards of respectability, dignity and modesty in the hostel block and campus. So as to not shock or embarrass others. Disciplinary action will be initiated against boarders not complying with these norms.
- Boarders are to recheck, to switch off the tube light, fan and water tap before going out of the room
- Use of induction stove, water heating coil and cooking in the hostel room is prohibited
- All the students are required to cooperate with the staff and security personnel in maintaining DISCIPLINE SAFETY AND SECURITY ON THE CAMPUS.

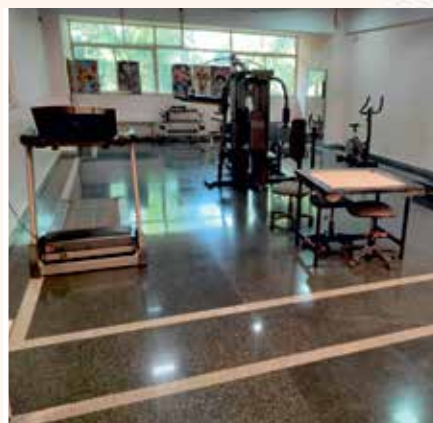

Health Care Facilities

The University accords top priority to the health of the students. In Ramaiah Technology Campus, Peenya, a doctor visits the campus daily to look into the health problems of students. An ambulance is always kept ready to take student to a nearby hospital in times of emergency. In Gnanagangothri Campus, the Ramaiah Group Hospitals are located within the campus and students have the facility to consult doctors at any time. Dental health check-up is also extended to the students.

Student Health Insurance & Health Care:

The students are covered under Group Health Insurance Policy wherein each student can avail hospitalization expenses up to Rs. 50,000.00 per year. For this, the student must be admitted as 'In Patient' in a hospital for a minimum of 25 hours. Health insurance card is distributed to all students.

Service to Society

In order to serve and understand the community in which we live, identify the needs and problems of the community and develop a sense of social and civic responsibility the university has formed three categories of social service units to meet the above mentioned objectives, namely

- NSS units and its activities
- Dental Social Service Unit through Department of Public Health Dentistry of Faculty of Dental Science
- Mandatory Service to Society program

Every student in the second year of under graduate study has to mandatorily participate in a "Service to Society" program. Blood Donation Camps are held for willing donors to donate blood for a noble cause.



Career Support

The Directorate of Student Affairs assists each student in exploring placement prospects by inviting various companies for campus recruitment drive for final year students. Moreover, there is a Placement Council, consisting of members from the industries, alumni, senior faculty members and students to plan and strategize internship and placement activities for students.

The students are prepared for their final placement through an incessant and structured interface with the industry through vigorous internships, guest talks and industrial visits, industry ready course curriculum and Pre-placement training sessions.

Alumni Council

To bring together all the Alumni of the University, the Alumni Council is formed consisting of Officers of the University and Alumni, to devise and execute plans for the fulfilling of the objectives of the Council. The University encourages the interaction of alumni with its students to bridge the gap between the industry and academics through a Lecture series called Alumni Speak.
